Important news from Contact for families with disabled children-Formerly known as Contact a Family

"Our ambition as a charity is to reach more families with disabled children, and to be there as soon as they need us. To achieve this, we set out to extend our appeal to young families; to make our formation and online presence more accessible; and to bolster the support we provide families in those stressful early days.

Our new brand is an important part of this work and was developed in partnership with parents, including some parent carer forums, to do two things:

- help us articulate who we are and what we can offer more clearly
- help families understand what we can do to support them quickly and easily

When we undertook the brand review one of the barriers that families identified was our old name. Parents told us that it made them think we were something that we weren't or that they had to do something they didn't want to do. So, we decided to shorten

our name to Contact. Unlike 'Contact a Family', 'Contact'

doesn't attempt to describe any or all areas of our work, but it's at the heart of everything we do: whether that's putting families in contact with each other or in contact with us.

Our new mark looks like this:

As you may know, the world of disability can be overwhelming for families, particularly in the early days, so we have made the way we look simpler, clearer and approachable. Moreover, we have overhauled our online and print information to make it more accessible and easier for families to navigate. Our new website is mobile-optimised to support the growing number of families visiting on their phone or tablet. The website is live today so do take a look.

And as well as new look guides for families, we are publishing a brand new free resource, The Helpful Guide for Families with Disabled Children, a little book for families in those early days, when they don't know where to

Mrunal has been involved in the Parent Carer Forum movement since May 2013. During this time he has been a steering group member of the Bedford Borough Parent Carer Forum and served as chair from its inception in May 2013 until June 2016. He was also chair of the Eastern Region of Parent Carer

Forums between May 2014 and January 2016. Mrunal was appointed NNPCF steering group member for the East of England in December 2016. In his professional life Mrunal has held a number of director level positions in the financial and the charity sector over a 25-year career and brings a valuable mix of personal and professional experience to the role.

Local Participation News

Parent participation is a vital component of service development and change across Peterborough. Wherever services exist relating to children and young people aged 0-25 who have special educational needs and disabilities commissioners (those in the Local Authority who develop and fund services) are keen to actively include parent carers.

The right to be heard and included rests within the Children and Families Act 2014. The importance of participation can be found in section 19 of part 3 of the act and is defined by the following principles:

The **Section 19 Principles** are a duty to have regard to:

- The views, wishes and feelings of the child, young person or parent
- The importance of their full participation in decisions
- The importance of their being provided with the necessary information and support to participate
- The need to support the child or young person to achieve the best possible educational and other outcomes, preparing them effectively for adulthood

At FVP we are working to include parent carers through a variety of methods; from online surveys and face to face focus groups through to parent representation. We know how important your voice is and want any changes to reflect this.

As we start the Autumn term there are some ongoing and emerging participation opportunities to let you know about.

Cambridgeshire and Peterborough SEND Strategy

Work is starting to take place to develop a shared vision and principles for SEND across Cambridgeshire and Peterborough. Parent carers sharing their views on this is vital to help commissioners plan the most appropriate services they can for our children and young people. They are interested in hearing what outcomes we want for our children/young people and how we see the future for them. We will put information about this on our website as soon as we have more and will share opportunities to get involved in our Facebook group.

The county wide work will not affect what is delivered locally, it is about having a shared vision with separate actions for each authority. What the work will entail is some close working between FVP and Pinpoint Cambridgeshire.

0-25 Transformation

Continued work is taking place to transform services for those aged 0-25 with SEND; this relates to children with disability social care, short breaks services and preparing for adulthood.

Over the spring term we shared a survey for parent carers to have say about what the current short break services look like and what they would want to see going forwards. This survey was followed up by a series of Facebook discussions. All

this information was collated and passed to commissioners who are now looking at what services will be delivered and how they will be delivered in the near future.

Cambridgeshire and Peterborough Foundation Trust (CPFT)

CPFT are looking to implement service level changes and would like to have parent carers involved as much as possible. These relate to various areas from CAMHs to areas relating to disabled children.

Some work we have already done with CPFT relates to the development of a series of "social stories" guides to appointments and the child development centre. These guides have been produced by parents for parents and are available to download from our website. https://www.familyvoice.org/Participation

Local Offer

There is still ongoing work in the development and design of the Local Offer (LO) and your input will have a direct impact on how it looks and feels to use.

On another level the LO is also the route by which you can shape services. The information you provide via the LO feedback system is used to inform commissioning of services. You can provide feedback directly to the Local Authority via the LO and

comments made will be responded to. If you are unhappy or happy with services you can let the Local Authority know this via the LO.

Physiotherapy and Occupational Therapy Review

A review is under way of Paediatric Physiotherapy and Occupational Therapy services and commissioners would like to ensure parent carers are included in this review. Two joint parent carer and professional sessions will be taking place across Cambridgeshire and Peterborough in the next couple of weeks.

The session in Peterborough will run on Wednesday 13th September between 12.30 and 2.30.

The session will take place at FVP, The Goldhay Centre, PE2 5QP.

A light lunch will be served at the start and support will be offered towards the cost of childcare and/or transport.

Preparing for Adulthood

Preparing for Adulthood (PfA) used to be known as Transitions and is about supporting our young people as they move towards being adults (14 to 25). The area covers employment, supported internships, moving out of home and taking part in adult life. This is an area where we really need parental input to ensure what plans are being made

meet the needs of all of our young people.

Partnership Boards

One way parent carers can participate individually or via parent representative support through Local Authority Partnership Boards. The boards are for Commissioners, Providers, Local Authority Officers, Voluntary Sector Organisations, Other Organisations and Service Users/ Carers to come together to discuss current services, strategies and planned changes and developments to services. The boards that may be of interest to parent carers are as follows:

Learning Disability Board

The Learning Disability Partnership Board (LDPB) mainly focuses on adults with LD and their carers as however they do look at those with LD who are preparing for adulthood. The board meets quarterly and is co-chaired by an adult with an LD.

<u>Autism Board</u>

The Autism Board focuses on children and adults with Autism and their carers. This is one area of

work where we have been asked to gather more parent carer views.

The board is looking at the new children and adults strategy for autism and also joint working across Cambridgeshire and Peterborough.



Physical Disabilities Board

Carers Board

The Carers Partnership Board (CPB) has gone through a refresh and is now co-chaired by Peterborough City Council and Carers Trust. The board is for carers to have a voice and shape the carers strategy. It is at this board we have the opportunity to raise awareness of parent carers in particular. This is important as we have found this is one of the most unrecognised group of carers. We are seeking representation at this board which meets quarterly.
