News on the contract to support parent carer and children and young people's participation

Contact and the National Network of Parent Carer Forums (NNPCF) are delighted to announce that the Department for Education (DfE) has confirmed that Contact, as part of a newly formed consortium with KIDS, the Council for Disabled Children (CDC) and the NNPCF, is the preferred bidder for the contract to support the strategic participation of

children, young people and parent carers and that they aim to sign a contract with us within a reasonable period.

All four organisations are delighted that our consortium bid has been successful, and we are looking forward to working together over the next two years to build on our current individual support offers, learning from each other's experiences and developing new synergised approaches that further enhance both children and young people's and parent carer participation.

We are really pleased to be able to continue working with parent carer forums and are also excited to be joining forces with KIDS and CDC to share learning and expertise between parent carer participation and participation with children and young people.

Department for Education publishes latest forum SEND survey

The Department for Education (DfE) has published its latest newsletter, including the headline figures from the Autumn 2017 special educational needs and disability (SEND) implementation survey of local authorities and parent carer forums on the SEND reforms.

The surveys are coordinated jointly by Contact, the National Network of Parent Carer Forums, NHS England and the DfE. They help assess progress with the SEN reforms and help the government to identify what's working well and where additional resources are needed to meet the challenges involved in introducing the new system.

With less than a month to go until the implementation phase of the reforms is complete, there is still a very mixed picture of progress towards this deadline:

- 111, or 73% of parent carer forums responded to the survey.
- 69% of forums who completed the survey are now largely or fully engaged in strategic planning with their local authority.
- 49% of forums are confident that their local authority is meeting the 20-week deadline for producing at least 90% of Education, Health and Care (EHC) plans.
- 82% of local authorities completed the survey.
- 20% said that children are fully or largely engaged in strategic planning of SEN services, 41% said that young people are fully or largely engaged, and 88% said that parents are fully or largely engaged.
 - 38% are issuing at least 90% of EHC plans within 20 weeks.

- Represent FVP at meetings and events
- To represent collectively families of children with disabilities or additional needs by providing a liaison point for Statutory and Voluntary Agencies within Peterborough.
- To fully complete reports after meetings
- To agree to undertake training when requested
- To attend meetings when required on behalf of FVP
- To attend pre-meeting briefings to obtain the information needed.
- To report back to the participation lead/ board of trustees
- To keep forum co-ordinator informed of meetings/ discussions/ outcomes
- To fully complete reports after meetings
- Any other participation duties as and when requested

When/ Commitment:

- Most meetings occur between the hours on 9.30 and 2.30 Monday to Friday
- Some work outside these

hours may be required and will be discussed in advance

 Approximately 3 hours per month and more if agreeable.

Skills/ Experience Required

- Parent Carer of Child or Young Person with a Disability or Special Education Needs up to the age of 25.
 We welcome applications from bereaved parents within five years of bereavement.
- Willing and able to report back to the Board of Trustee and other team members using the agreed reporting document
- To know when to personalise to empathise your point
- Ensuring input in to meetings is based on a representational model of involvement, and not purely based on personal experience
- Demonstrates and promotes parent carers' voice by parent carers at all levels
- Acknowledges that Parent carers have an independent and unique voice
- Models and promotes recognition of skills and experience of parent carers

Disability Peterborough

Inc:The Disability Forum, Inspire Peterborough and Shopmobility

Disability Peterborough Focus Group questionnaire

Together with its projects, Shopmobility Peterborough and Inspire Peterborough, we work to promote disability equality, high-quality support, specialist advice, mobility equipment and accessible sports and leisure activities.

and/or disabilities

Improving outcomes for children & young people who have special educational needs and/or disabilities

Key Lines of Enquiry:

How effective is the leadership and governance of SEND across the area?

How effective is the capacity and resources (including finance) across the local area?

How effectively does the local area identify children and young people who have special educational needs and/or disabilities?

How effectively does the local area assess and meet the needs of SEND children and young people?

How effectively does the local area improve outcomes for SEND children and young people?

Have the council got it

right in terms of challenges and strengths for SEND?

Are the priorities right, in this period of development?

The review will assess how it all works in practice and improves outcomes.





Spotlight

Families First Peterborough CIC

Families First Peterborough CIC works with families, young people and children in community settings and schools providing positive activities and support.

We deliver free Open Access Play sessions at Crofts Corner for children and families. Where they can make new friends, play games and sports, do arts and crafts and try new things! Open Access Play takes place on Saturdays in term time and Fridays in the school holidays. All sessions run from 10 - 3pm. We have a Lunchtime Club at £1 per person. Through our activities we tackle issues such as poverty, isolation, challenging behaviour and social exclusion. We support families to participate in community events too.

We also deliver a targeted service called the Flipside Project. Children and young people receive individual support packages. We use a one-to-one approach to enable them to learn new skills and grow in confidence.

Crofts Corner

We are based at Crofts Corner in Bretton, next door to Eyrescroft Primary School. During school hours we facilitate the Flipside Project, however we do offer one to one support at weekends and in the school holidays too. On the Saturdays and in the holidays we run Open Access Play sessions and other events. Crofts Corner has a lovely big garden, however we could really do with some support to maintain it. The centre has great potential, but is in need of some refurbishment work. We want to undertake a project to refurbish the building to make it more suitable for the different activities we provide. We would also like to install some new outside play equipment too and undertake some landscaping.
